


MADRID

The Community of Madrid is one of the 17 Autonomous Communities or regions of Spain and is located in the geographical centre of our country, in the most southwestern part of Europe. It hosts 179 municipalities, including the city of Madrid, the capital of Spain, one of the most attractive and admired cities due to its great potential and quality of life.

In an area of 8,030 square kilometres, the region hosts a wide variety of locations within very short distance, ranging from snowy high mountain landscapes to desert areas or one of Europe's most vibrant metropolis. This diversity also enjoys both an excellent inner connectivity, thanks to its extensive road network, and external communications, with one of Europe's leading airports and the central hub of the world's second largest high-speed rail network.

The climate offers a wide range of temperatures, oscillating between 0°C in winter and 40°C in summer, and more than 3,200 hours of sunshine per year, which means that at any time of the year you can enjoy one of its famous blue skies, that made painters, such as Velázquez, fall in love with the city.





Tax Incentives and Subsidies

The Madrid region offers an attractive system of tax incentives of up to 30% on the first million euros, and 25% on the rest of the expenditure made in Spain. The eligibility for these incentives include national productions and coproductions, as well as to international productions shot in the Community of Madrid.

The types of productions eligible include feature films, television series, animated films and documentaries; and short films, in case of national productions. They must be produced by a Spanish production company registered in the Registry of Audiovisual Companies of the Spanish Ministry of Culture and Sports. In the case of an international production, it must be applied for by the Spanish producer in charge of implementing the foreign project.

The maximum refund limit is up to 10 million euros with a minimum expenditure in Spain of 1 million euros for production costs, 200,000 euros for pre-production and post-production costs for animation and visual effects.

Eligible costs: creative staff domiciled in the country or in another EU country (up to a limit of €100,000 per person), technical and ancillary services.

Locations


The Madrid region offers a wide variety of locations within very short distance, ranging from the arid areas in the south or the forests, lakes and high mountain landscapes in the north to the countless urban spaces available in a modern and cosmopolitan city like Madrid.


The region has an extensive heritage and interesting monuments that include medieval castles and monasteries, Baroque palaces and churches, historic gardens and even an Egyptian temple, with five World Heritage Sites: The Monastery and Royal Site of San Lorenzo de El Escorial, the University and Historical Centre of Alcalá de Henares, the Cultural Landscape of Aranjuez, the impressive Montejo Beech Forest and, in the heart of the city centre of Madrid, the so-called "Landscape of Light" comprising the Paseo del Prado and El Buen Retiro Park.

Our region hosts a wide selection of versatile and unique locations that have historically been used for many productions that ha recreated cities in the US (AMC's Soulmates, Movistar+'s La fortuna), Russia (David Lean's Doctor Zhivago, Netflix's In from the cold), Paris (Henry Hathaway's The Fabulous World of the Circus), Buenos Aires (Movistar+'s Dime quien soy) or New Mexico (Wes Anderson's new film), among many others.


